Congratulation Graduates! The Major graduated 296 students over the course of the academic year. In total, 2585 students have earned bachelor's degrees in the Major since its inception.

Five-Year Strategic Plan: Program leadership, staff, and faculty implemented Year 2 of the program's strategic plan, including hiring increasingly diverse instructors and developing new courses in race, racism, and public health, service learning, and portfolio, which are set to launch in AUT 2024.

Student & Academic Services Highlights:

- The **PH-GH Major Honors Program** received a record number of applications at 54. Thirty-eight students were offered admission, with 36 accepting, making the cohort the largest to date.
- Student and academic services expanded with additional prospective advising and referrals to resources.
- Five Student Resource Coordinators coordinated social justice-themed programs and community building events like the PH-GH
 Major Open House and Graduation Celebration and collaborated with the SPH Student & Academic Services team and UW
 Graduate School. SRCs conducted peer advising with prospective students, managed the phgh_undergrads Instagram, and
 supported the PH-GH advising office.
- PH-GH advisers facilitated **in-class workshops and alumni panels** on topics including: social identity, systemic power, and job search strategies.


A Preview of What is Happening for PH-GH in AY 2024-2025

- Move into the third year of the Major's **five-year strategic plan** including implementing new courses (Race, Racism, and Public Health; Public Health Service Learning), surveying antiracist paradigms and pedagogies across the curriculum and student and academic services, and preparing to expand enrollment to 700 students.
- Extend **Student Resource Coordinator** positions into the summer, allowing for student-led programming outside the academic year.
- Continue integration of EDI, career development, and health and wellness with curricular and co-curricular activities.
- Continue offering the PH-GH Major's first study abroad Public Health Nepal.

Collaboration Highlights:

- The **SPH Undergraduate Symposium** celebrated its 11th anniversary. Seventy-two students presented 37 posters from Environmental Public Health Major, Food Systems, Nutrition, and Health Major, Health Informatics and Health Information Management Major, Public Health-Global Health Major, Global Health Minor, and Nutrition Minor.
- Founded the **SPH Undocu Working Group** in January 2024, which consists of faculty and staff across the SPH. The group provides education, advocacy, and support for students who are undocumented within the School and across the UW campuses.
- Collaborated with **Educational Opportunity Program** and the **College Assistance Migrant Program** to host quarterly all-school information sessions and application workshops for first-generation, low income, and underrepresented minority students.
- Collaborated with the Latinx Health Board to conduct oral histories to as part of a research project aimed at understanding Latinx young adults experiences of mental health. Also with LxHB and WA State History Museum, analyzed the oral histories gathered during the COVID-19 pandemic and created a digital display that included photos and quotes. Partnered with FrEsCo to create culturally-relevant cookbooks and health-focused infographics. Embarked upon a new partnership with Circle of Friends to create short videos to destigmatize mental illness. Entering our 3rd year with the WA West African Center, students created and administered an after-school curriculum. Students worked shelter shifts at ROOTS (a partner since 2012), and created season 4 of our podcast series Seattle Unsheltered. Continued the Major's long-term partnership Vulnerable Populations Strategic Initiative to teach stroke and fall prevention to older adults.
- The **SPH Undergraduate Commons** hosted instructor and teaching assistant office hours with the following departments: Biostatistics; Epidemiology; Food Systems, Nutrition, and Health; and instructors for the PH-GH Major.
